

- 1. How do you understand the value of work, in general? How do you understand the value of your specific employment?

(e.g. unprotected handling of toxins)


Should not involve many hours in "an uneasy posture"





Work:

Vork Should not hurt our neighbor Not financially - honest dealing, no undercutting, no usury Not physically - do not trade in items which harm others' health Not spiritually – nothing that causes temptation to sin (gambling, pornography)
